

# Profile of a Quilter: Marline Turner

Marline Turner has worked tirelessly to advance quilting in KZN and SA for many years. She has represented KZNQG at SAQG for 18 years. Sadly, Marline resigned from Committee this year.

Marline remembers the start of her sewing journey fondly: "I started quilting from a very young age, probably age 6. My paternal Grandmother brought me up, she was an accomplished sewer and encouraged me all the way."

"I would make cushion covers using Hexagons. She always said 'If something is worth doing, do it to the best of your ability'."

"I was never allowed to start a new project if I

had not completed something that I had already started. That has carried on through my quilting journey as I honestly do not have UFOs."

34 accredited South African quilt teachers and 6 internationally renowned teachers will be offering workshops at Festival.

## Quilters' attention is drawn to the following important RULES for Entering the South African National Quilt Competition:

An entrant can pay someone for having done work on their entry only in the Collaborative and/or Group categories. *The person who is paid is considered to be one of the entrants*. The name(s) of the paid entrant/quilter and the type of work done e.g. design, piecing, quilting, embellishing or finishing, *must be stated on the entry form*.

A maximum of four (4) entries are allowed per person. Thus, a participating quilter can enter no more than four (4) quilts into the competition, whether you enter as an individual in the Bed, Wall, Open and/or any other individual optional categories, or as a participant of a category that includes Collaborative Quilts, Group Quilts or Community Quilts. Those who have been paid to work on a quilt are also considered an entrant on the quilt and therefore the rule of a maximum of four (4) entries also applies to these persons.





Size: 30cm x 30cm


<u>Criteria:</u> ONLY the 6 colours of the SAQG logo may be used.


Our October meeting was a lovely outing to see the fibre works exhibition at the NSA gallery, followed by delicious cake and coffee at their coffee shop.

us a little of everything that she does – SO inspirational... All photos are of Wendy's work.



are looking forward to a very productive year.




On a personal note and in the spirit of completing UFO's, I finally got my shaggy quilt finished (see photo on the right) The pattern had been in my "to do" file

been oiled & ready to sew. We now need the inspiration to flow ......





Our first meeting on 17<sup>th</sup> January was very well attended with several visitors.
