

South African quilt entries are invited for the annual World Quilt Competition. It's a wonderful opportunity to exhibit your quilts in the USA with shipping and customs handled by the World Quilt Competition organisers. This is the 20th consecutive year that South Africa has taken part in the competition.

There are some changes which you will see in the Entry Form: the new minimum size requirement allows for smaller quilts to be entered, more special prizes have been added and the prize money for the competition has increased.

Here's a brief summary about the World Quilt competition:

- The **minimum** quilt size is 6606 square centimeters / 1024 square inches (e.g. 81.30 x 81.30 cms / 32 x 32 inches).
- Quilts must have been completed in 2018 or 2019 or 2020.
- MAY 19, 2020 is the closing date for your Entry Form and JPG images.
- There is a non-refundable fee of R100.00 per entry. If your quilt is selected by the USA jurors, there is a further R200.00 fee.
- Accepted entries will premiere at World Quilt New England in August 2020, then tour to other Mancuso shows in the USA through November 2020.

The SAQG Pro Dedicate Award was presented to Paul Schutte in 2019.

Paul Schutte is a Master Quilter, a respected National and International judge, a renowned, inspirational and popular guilt-making teacher, an ambassador for

promoting SA quilt-making regionally, nationally and internationally. Paul has dedicated his service as a member of SAQG, from inception, to date, in various representative capacities, and as its President between 1996—1999.

"I delight in Light, Colour, Texture, Fabric Form & Stitching to create Quilt Art" - **Paul Schutte**



Paul kindly agreed to provide us with more personal insight into his art and quilt making via an email interview.

KZNQG: We understand that the start of your quilting journey has its origin with you helping your wife, Netta, to finish her quilts?

PAUL: Yes, it is true. Due to her full time job at the University and two sons to "educate" / rear, time was limited to finish unfinished tops. I gave my opinion about colour and fabric choices from the beginning, though. We were used to doing somethings together. I also helped with the ironing of fabric from the beginning. Being a more traditional quilter, she taught me how to do precise machine piecing.

KZNQG: Obviously you did some traditional quilting yourself. What initiated the move from traditional to your more arty style?

PAUL: I think it was a natural process of transition: One learns all possible quilting techniques by doing traditional patterns. In my case I was not satisfied enough with only traditional work and wanted to



do my own designs and wanted to "paint" with fabric. I am a dare devil and want to try everything. Also a bit eclectic in what I do.

KZNQG: What inspires you? I realise this is a very wide and general question.....Looking at your website and the quilts displayed, the impression I get is that you are attracted to nature and are upset by it's destruction and the negative effect that modern life and technology may have on our world?

PAUL: Nature; Yes, correct; especially trees; therefore my series about the destruction of nature due to careless technology. Sometimes I am also inspired by a piece of fabric or a certain shade or colour. In this case I will start with the fabric and go from there to an appropriate design. I love mathematics and therefore love to design my geometric oriented quilts on graph paper. The quilts about nature are done with an improvisational approach: let's start and see what happens as I go along.

KZNQG: What is your favourite technique to use?

PAUL: My techniques are rather conservative in the sense I mostly use ordinary quarter inch piecing. I am not at the forefront of the newest techniques. In my nature quilts I also use a lot of raw edge applique with improvisational / free style piecing.

KZNQG: What/who has had the most profound effect on your artwork in the past 10 years or so and how/why?





PAUL: I am not sure. I think nearly every work

of art or a quilt that I see and admire has some influence on me. Maybe, to a certain extent Ruth MacDowell but I use a different method or technique.

KZNQG: What's next? are you planning to exhibit at an upcoming International quilt show? can you give us a hint at what you are working on next?

PAUL: No plans for an exhibition at the moment. I take part in group exhibitions of Fibre Works and FACT (an Art group in Cape Town). As I am also due to teach this year in Port Elizabeth and the Free State, I am busy with samples for my classes. I also plan to do another tree series, but in a more abstract style. Oh dear, I must try to use all my fabric stash before my eyes will fade and my back collapse, so to speak.

Paul will be teaching two classes of two days each in Durban during the last week of February—the course is "Gaudi and Orphan Blocks" inspired by Gaudi's architecture and mosaics, as seen in Barcelona. The classes are now full, thus no

Paul is also the KZNQG guest speaker on Saturday 29th February at the Open Day, from 9am at the Hillcrest Primary School.

MQG wraps up 2019

At the final 2019 meeting in November last year, the Midlands Quilters' Guild celebrated over a Christmas lunch with representatives from their chosen charity, the Jes Foord Foundation (JFF). Many people will recall the brutal gang rape suffered by Jes while walking the family dogs with her father in 2008. But the true story lies in her turning that torrid crime into an organisation that brings support and assistance to rape victims in various ways, so that they can progress from being victims to being survivors. In the current era of exposure of this global criminal trend in every level of society, Jes is a shining star.

A collectively-made king size quilt, aptly named "Starlight Express" (for bringing some light on dark situations, and put together in record time for a quilt of this size) was raffled and won by Margot Morford from Durban (see first photo), having raised over R13,200.

This money was presented to JFF PR Manager, Trish Gillespie (see second photo), along with a car boot full of donations for packs for adult and child rape victims.

Another recent outreach project had many KZN MQG members rallying to contribute, following a global appeal from another MQG (Modern Quilting Guild) in Wollongong, Australia: following the devastating

bushfires, they were requesting that quilters around the world assemble blocks with trees on them, symbolic of life, nourishment and re-growth. Two dozen blocks (see third photo) were couriered from KZNs MQG to Australia this week. They will be assembled into quilts by the Australian MQG, and donated to bushfire victims who have lost their homes.
