### The Two Step

#### About Carol:



Carol started patchwork and quilting in the early 90's and has never looked back.

She began teaching in 1996, and obtained her SAQG teachers accreditation 2014.

She has been invited to teach in Swaziland and Dubai and has taught in SA National Festivals in Port Elizabeth and Durban.

Carol enjoys teaching basics to beginners and technique classes to the more experienced quilters.

She is always looking for quick and easy methods and loves to share them.

Carol started a Facebook page during lockdown and shared the progress of her scrap busting lock down quilt as well as many techniques and ideas via short videos. (See 'Carol's Quilting Classes' on Facebook)

#### The Two Step Class:

In the first session, students will learn the very impressive technique of inserting a circle into a piece of fabric with a neatly stitched seam; clean, neat and flat. Single and overlapping circles will be taught. (This is not an applique method).

The Line Dance technique will be taught for the balance of the

weekend. This amazing technique produces an interwoven design that appears far more complicated to construct than it actually is. Combining these two techniques and using the 'Quilt As You Go' technique, your table runner could be done by the end of the weekend!

Once mastered, these techniques can then be applied to larger projects.

### Intermediate Free Motion Quilting

#### About Carolyn:

Carolyn's journey with sewing began at the age of ten, making dolls clothes and eventually her own clothes...how boring!  
But then the fun began...

Carolyn discovered quilting which she has enjoyed for about 30 years; her passion being free motion quilting. In 2017 she completed the teachers' accreditation course with the South African Quilters Guild, enabling her to share her passion. Carolyn loves sharing with others while giving encouragement to students enabling them to realise that with a little practice, they can achieve beautiful quilting stitches. Carolyn's aim is to teach students to relax and most of all to have fun.



#### Intermediate Free Motion Quilting Class:

This is an intermediate quilting class for those who are comfortable with free motion quilting and would like to challenge themselves! In this class students will begin quilting a "whole-cloth" quilt. The first day they will begin quilting their blocks and the second day they will complete their quilting and join two blocks together with the "quilt-as-you-go" method. Students will then be able to complete the quilt in their own time.

### Handwork Weekend

#### Handwork Weekend class:

No sewing machine required!!!!!!

Students will be able to choose which of the 2 quilts they would like to make. They can either make a Tumbling Blocks Quilt or Inner City Blocks Quilt using English Paper Piecing. Students will learn a fun way to use up their stash to create a fabulous quilt with great visual impact. During the process of making these fun blocks, the magic of using colour value will become apparent.

Students are encouraged to bring along their "happiest" fabrics to spend some time playing with ric-rac braid.

### About Sally:

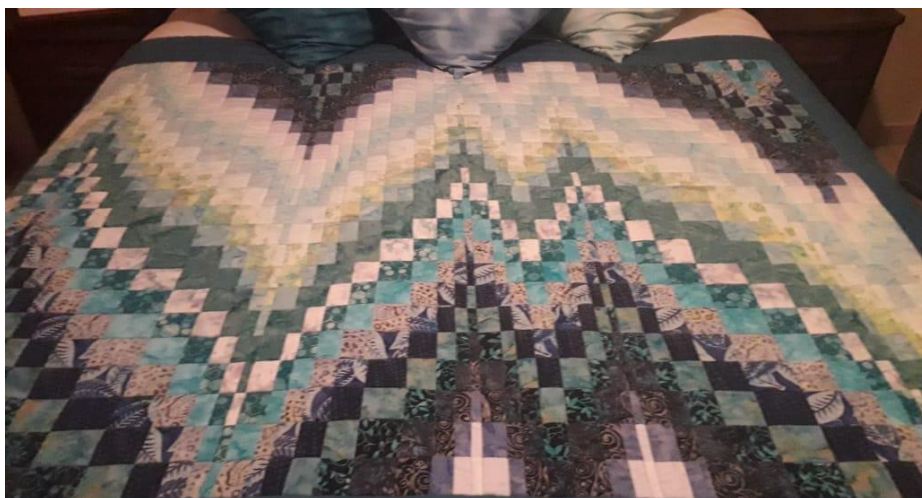

### Bargello Symphony class:

An invitation to create a unique “Bohemian Rhapsody”. The students will be guided through the bargello process each step of the way and the final result will be totally unique. It takes a LOT of sewing but the results are worth each stitch. There is no particular skill level required, just enthusiasm and the ability to sew a ¼” seam!!! With their instrument of choice, Bernina, Elna, ..... whatever, there may even be a sing along! It is very possible to take home a completed quilt top at the end of the weekend. The size of the quilt top without borders is approximately 150cm X 130cm or 60” x 50”.

### About Sue:

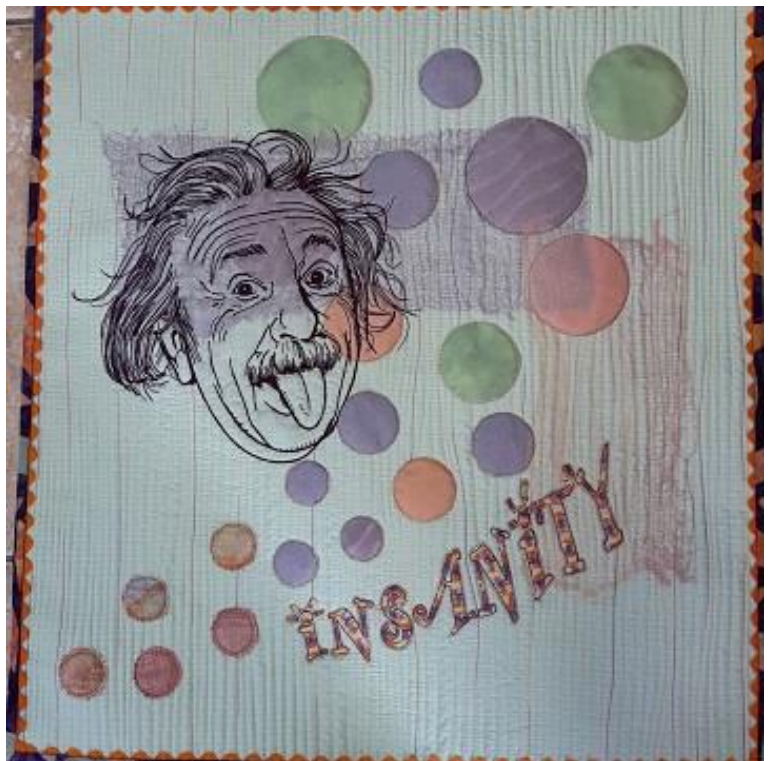


Sue Cameron is an International award-winning master quilter with a passion for fabric and what can be done with it.

There is no need for a cumbersome, long Tunisian crochet hook, just a regular old-fashioned hook. Students can plan a project or simply use leftover yarn from their stash. Once they have the hang of it, it's a breeze! This is a very useful technique for throws, cushion covers, tablet covers and the like.
